

What is AccessHealth Tri-County Network?

AccessHealth Tri-County Network provides community care navigation services to low-income individuals who <u>do not</u> have health insurance and need access to primary care services.

AccessHealth is based on physicians, community partners, and hospitals volunteering their time and services to serve patients. AccessHealth is NOT an insurance program.

AccessHealth Tri-County Network serves as the Hub of Tri-County Diabetes Prevention Programs that connect individuals with CDC-recognized Lifestyle change programs to reduce the burden of Type 2 Diabetes in the Tri-County area.

Who is eligible for AccessHealth?

To qualify for participation in AccessHealth patients must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Patient typically falls in the age range of 19 through 64.
- Patient must be a resident of Berkeley,
 Charleston, or Dorchester counties.
- Patient does not have health insurance of any kind.
- A patient's household combined income must fall within 250% of the federal poverty guideline. (Example: Family of 4 with a household income less than \$5,000 monthly) Proof of Income must be provided at enrollment.
- Patient willingly wants to participate and complete enrollment in the program.

What services are available to me through AccessHealth?

Initially, patients are assigned a Community Care Navigator who will assess their health care needs. The Navigator will then assist patients with referrals to primary healthcare services at participating AccessHealth clinics, health centers, or physician offices.

AccessHealth can also help access limited supportive and specialty services. The list of specialties and services will vary depending on the availability of providers and resources.

AccessHealth Navigators can enroll individuals in a Lifestyle Change Program to develop healthy habits.

Is there a limit as to how long a patient can be enrolled in AccessHealth?

No. The average enrollment in AccessHealth is approximately one year. Patients are rescreened for eligibility at that time for continued access to services.
